

The funding allowed us to promote sustainable food by providing inspirational vegetarian meal options people could try at home. Our feeling had been that people would be happy to increase veg intake for both health and environmental reasons, if they had a collection of tried and tested ideas that are easy to prepare.

We took along three recipes for quick and easy food with free samples to give away. They included easy marinated Tofu, Quinoa tabouleh, and Blackberry and apple fool. Ingredients were sourced locally (in the case of the blackberries, foraged from local hedgerows), also enabling us to talk about food miles and link to our 'grow your own' promotion, and highlighting of community gardens.

The festival was busy and we were able chat to around 150 people with 250 free food samples given out.

The response was overwhelmingly positive. With the majority of people visiting not being either vegetarian or vegan, but interested in trying the food and taking photos of the recipes or QR codes to try at home.

### What you achieved

What were the benefits of your project? (Maximum 500 words)

The project has supported the theory that providing inspiration can help people to consider changing their eating habits and trying new things.

We hope those who visited the stall will give the recipes a go and look for more ways to try meat alternatives for regular meals. It's was clear most visitors were open to the idea and that having something to try encouraged them to think about how good the meat alternatives can be, and how new recipes

	can be really enjoyable as well as sustainable.  Having the free samples was a great way to draw people into conversations about the carbon footprint of our diets. We were also able to discuss food miles, local food sources, and point out the fantastic community gardens available in the Holme Valley.
Who benefited from the project? (Maximum 200 words)	People visiting the stall benefitted directly from the activity provided and many went away with the new recipes.  Ultimately if we can encourage a shift towards more sustainable lifestyles, we all benefit from the reduced impact on our environment.
How many people benefited? (Maximum 200 words)	We estimate that around 150 directly benefitted from the activity, with 250 samples given out.
Was the project inclusive?  How were marginalised groups (elderly, disabled, young people etc) able to participate?	The activity took place in an accessible public space and was open to all visitors to the food festival.
Reflecting on climate change, did the project address any aspects of the climate emergency? How?	The aim of the project was to draw attention to the impact of our food choices on our climate. We wanted to do this in a positive way, focusing on what we can gain in terms of enjoying different foods, trying new recipes, and having a personally healthier diet.  Given the positive response received we would be keen to deliver a similar event again and continue to encourage a
