The CCTV project in Honley Village was delivered to enhance community safety, reduce crime and anti-social behaviour, and support the sustainability of local businesses within the village centre.

Cameras were installed in key locations, including retail areas, public access points and car parks. The system is operational and accessible to authorised personnel in partnership with local policing teams.

The project has met its core objectives and is delivering measurable and qualitative community benefits.

The project aimed to:

- Reduce anti-social behaviour and criminal activity
- Provide evidential support to West Yorkshire Police
- Improve public confidence and perceptions of safety
- Protect local businesses and public assets

- The CCTV is managed by a private Company who service, repair and monitors the system to ensure it is kept in good working order throughout the year. The grant was to pay for this annual maintenance contract.

Enhancing safety in publicly accessible areas, it supports equal access to the village Centre regardless of age, gender, disability or background. The system particularly benefits vulnerable groups, including elderly residents, young people and those accessing the village during evening hours, by increasing reassurance and reducing anti-social behaviour. The project operates in compliance with data protection legislation and does not discriminate in its coverage or application.</p>

How?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Modern CCTV equipment installed is energy-efficient and low-consumption. • Infrastructure was integrated into existing street furniture where possible, minimising additional materials and groundworks. • By supporting a safe and sustainable village centre, the project contributes indirectly to the viability of local businesses, helping residents shop locally and reducing the need to travel further afield. <p>Overall, the project has a minimal environmental footprint and does not negatively impact climate objectives.</p>

The project has delivered against its stated objectives by improving community safety, acting as a deterrent to anti-social behaviour, supporting local police with evidential footage, and increasing reassurance for residents and businesses. Feedback from stakeholders indicates that the system is providing the intended benefits and contributing positively to the village environment.</p>
