Purpose for which the grant was awarded (Maximum 20 words)	The creation of accessible and universal gender-neutral toilet facilities within the Clubhouse, together with a baby-changing area.

The Story of Your Project

We installed a universal toilet, a fully enclosed room containing a toilet, washbasin and hand-drying facilities, in our Clubhouse. The room allows wheelchair users and those with impaired mobility to access a suitable toilet on our premises.

We created a new room, accessed from a corridor which is adjacent to the wheelchair friendly entrance, with sufficient space for wheelchair access, complete with grab rails, a lower washbasin, and an emergency pull cord system.

The work involved:

- moving stud walls to take space from our existing Male Changing Room to create a separate room
- creating access to that room from the existing corridor
- installing accessible toilet facilities to the created room
- moving the existing toilet cubicle in the Male Changing Room
- installing a toilet and washbasin in the new toilet cubicle in the Male Changing Room

Most of the work was undertaken by volunteer members during our closed winter season. Only £330 of the grant money was spent on an external plastering contractor. The remainder of the money was spent on materials.

What you achieved

<p>What were the benefits of your project? (Maximum 500 words)</p>	<p>We have provided excellent facilities for club members and Holme Valley residents to visit the Club, regardless of their accessibility needs.</p> <p>Wheelchair users and those with impaired mobility living in the Holme Valley are now able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • support children who are part of the Club • attend social events at the Club • attend the club with friends and family to watch the sailing and enjoy the surroundings <p>In addition, people of any sex, gender or gender identity will be able to visit the club, to take part in sailing activities or support family members, and find facilities where they can feel comfortable.</p>
<p>Who benefited from the project? (Maximum 200 words)</p>	<p>It is very early in our season (we have been open only a few weeks), but we already see that members and visitors are benefitting. For example, we recently had a meeting onsite with Yorkshire Water. We were able to offer smart new facilities which did not involve passing through wet and messy changing areas. Going through the season, we particularly expect wheelchair users, those with limited mobility, and parents of young children to gain the most benefit.</p>
<p>How</p>	<p>Again, it is just the start of our season, but with respect to numbers, we</p>

<p>many people benefited ? (Maximum 200 words)</p>	<p>already have 57 sailing members and 11 Model boat members who benefit from the new facilities. This year we have “sail, cake and fun” days added to our programme where we will attract many visitors and potential new members – as a Club we are now able to be proud of the inclusive facilities we offer.</p>

How were marginalised groups (elderly, disabled, young people etc) able to participate?</p>	<p>This project was very inclusive for the following reasons</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The facilities were installed specifically for people with disabilities, those who wish to use a gender-neutral toilet, and young people • Our project was undertaken by a group of club members aged between 17 and 81
<p>Reflecting on climate change, did the project address any aspects of the climate emergency? How?</p>	<p>We took the following action to minimise the impact of our project on the climate emergency:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • used Fibo wall panels made from PEFC-certified wood, which guarantees sustainable forestry, to reduce the use of plaster, plasterboard, and paint. • installed a movement detector for the lighting to save energy when the room is not being used • installed an instant hot water heater to avoid storing hot water • Sourced a secondhand toilet
<p>Did you achieve what you were trying to</p>	<p>Yes, we did. The facilities look even better than we expected. The project came in on time and on budget. We expect the facilities to be used by Club members for many years to come.</p>

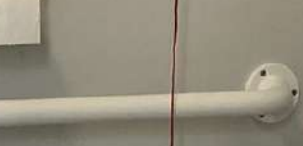
